Vinnies Winter Appeal



Celebrating 70 Years of St Gabriel's School



Did you know that the Church/Hall in Barrington Street was built in 1952, largely by volunteers. In 1955 the OLSH nuns opened a school in this space, with 85 children from grades 1-3.

In 1956, the school expanded and 4 new brick classrooms were built on Whittington Street, which are still in use today.

In 1980, the original building was demolished and new classrooms built.
