Easter



The Church continues celebrating the Season of Easter and will do so for the next four weeks. This Season began on Easter Sunday with the Resurrection. We recalled the instigation of the Eucharist, having its origins at the Last Supper and subsequent fulfilment in the

account of the travelers on the Road to Emmaus. The travelers who were blind to the presence of Jesus, were made aware of his companionship and grace through the breaking of bread and sharing wine.

A simple question we can ask ourselves in this Season of the Church is, how can we live in the light? This is what we are called to do as Easter People, to be beacons of light to show others The Way.

Each religious foundation has seasons of light and peace and we are enriched by celebrations such as Holy and Eid which also summon light into their communities.

Outreach to the Needy

This Term we will again be making soup for the needy over Winter. Children will work in small groups of about 15 to peel, dice and add ingredients to soup pots under the instruction of a staff member. The children will have a safety briefing before each cooking session to ensure their fingers are behind parring knife blades and peeler blades.

There will be an opportunity for families to donate \$5 via the Qkr! App to purchase ingredients for soup.

The soup we make will be donated to the Sr Janet Mead Drop In Day Centre for the Homeless in the city.

You will receive notification when your child will be helping with the soup making activity which usually lasts for about 30 minutes.

The Catholic church is excited to announce the election of a new Pope. Pope Leo XIV was elected early today emerging from St Peter's Basilica with the words, "Peace be with you".

The new Pope, Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost OSA (Order of Saint Augustine) is an American Cardinal born on September 14, 1955 in Chicago Illinois.

Pope Leo XIV has had much experience in ministry to the Word of the Gospel all over the world and was ordained the Bishop in Peru in 2013. He was made a Cardinal in September 2023.

School Fees 2025

School fee statements for term 2 have been sent home this week, please review to ensure you are on track to have your fee account paid by the end of November 2025.

School Card for 2025

School Card needs to be re-applied for on an annual basis. 2025 School Card application forms are now available online at the link below and from the Front Office, please apply as soon as possible.

For eligible families, St Gabriel's School lower income fee will apply once School Card is approved:

- 1st child Lower fee of \$1,380
- 2nd child Lower fee of \$1,040
- · and nil fees for further children.

A credit is applied to your account to reflect the lower fee and a revised statement sent home for you.

School Card Income Limits:

The tables below list the income limits for applications lodged in 2025 – based on the family's gross income in 2023/2024. To qualify for School Card, your family's gross income must be below a certain limit. This limit depends on how many dependent children you have. You will need to provide proof of income – such as payslips or Centrelink information.

The School Card Scheme is administered by the State Government to provide financial assistance towards the cost of education for full time students of lower income families. From the Community Group


Mother's Day
