### **Jubilee Memorial Centre Blessing**

#### **Barrington Avenue Emu Crossing Installation**

Following ongoing consultation with the Port Adelaide Enfield Council, this week an Emu Crossing has been installed on Barrington Avenue. This is the first of a few changes that will be made to Barrington Avenue that are aimed at ensuring the safety of our students, staff and families.

To support the safety and wellbeing of all please:

- Remain in your vehicle at the Kiss and Drop
- · Park close to the kerb so that other motorists can pass
- · Avoid parking where the bus stop is located

Once the crossing is operational the Port Adelaide Enfield Council will be closely monitoring driver behaviour and traffic flow, we ask that all motorists choose safe and responsible habits during drop off and pick up of children.

At the end of this term we will farewell two long serving members of our staff team who have contributed outstanding service to our school community.


